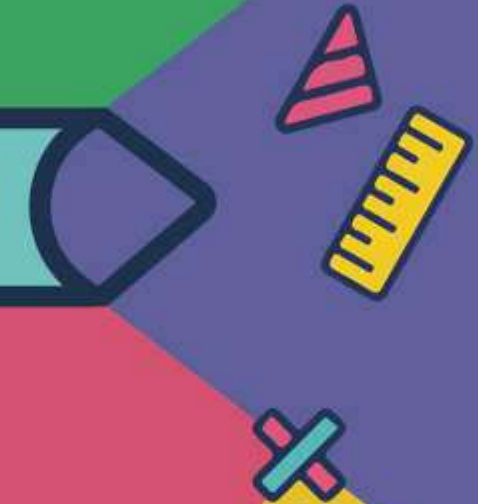

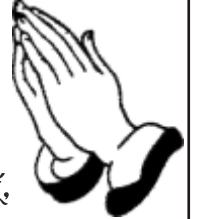

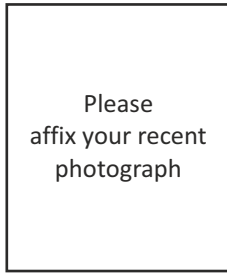
HOUSE SYSTEM

In collaboration with the parents and AWES management, Army Public School, Gwalior is all set to provide an educational environment in which all students will maximize their academic potential, demonstrate respect for individual differences, prepare themselves for future employment, have opportunities for life-enriching activities and become active participants in stewardship of their community as a whole.

**TO STUDENTS**

1. All students must be regular and punctual to school and in school activities. No one is allowed to leave the premises without the written permission of the Principal/with an out pass.
2. Every pupil is required to put in an attendance of not less 90% of the total number of working days in the school year. No pupil will be allowed to sit for the promotion examination unless he / she has the minimum attendance.
3. School tasks assigned by the teachers should be done punctually.
4. As the medium of instruction in this school is English, all are encouraged and urged to speak English in the school premises.
5. When the students leave the class room for sports, library, laboratory, etc. they must walk along the corridor, stairs and ground pathways in single line and in perfect silence.
6. Students are not allowed to remain in the classroom during recess or activity periods. Once in the playground, they should not return to the class room without the permission of the concerned teacher.
7. The school authorities do not hold themselves responsible for the student's loss of money, books, articles of clothing etc. The students are expected to look after their own belongings very carefully.
8. Students are not allowed to carry any mobile telephone & F.M. Radio to school. They are not permitted to come on two wheelers other than bicycles.
9. Students are expected not to wear any kind of expensive ornaments to school.
10. Students will follow Covid-19 protocols and bring their own duster for any needful cleanliness.

A WORD TO THE PARENTS

1. This Almanac is a connecting link between the parents and the school. Occasional remarks from the Teachers, Vice Principal and Principal are conveniently sent through the pages of this diary and the parents are requested to do likewise.
2. No school can achieve its objectives without the participation of the parents. The interest and involvement on the part of the parents consists in their efforts to understand and support the objectives of the school. It means:
 - a. The parents are living examples of the values taught to and expected of their children.
 - b. That the parents keep the Class Teacher/Academic Coordinator informed of any special problems, family circumstances, or other relevant facts.
 - c. The parents collaborate fully with every staff member.
3. The co-operation and support of the parents is expected to ensure:
 - a. That the students come to school regularly, punctually and are dressed neatly and correctly.
 - b. That the students bring to school their books and note books which should be properly maintained.
 - c. That the students do their homework regularly and prepare their lessons.
 - d. That they take an active and genuine interest in the activities of the school.
4. When communicating with the Principal, parents are requested to mention in their letters the name, class and section of the student.
5. By placing their children with the school, parents or guardians individually undertake to confirm and submit to the discipline of the school. They are given to understand that they cannot dictate to the School staff regarding the administration of the school.
6. The reports of the assessments/evaluations should be signed by the parent or the guardian. The whole year's performance is taken into consideration for promotion.
7. Visitors are NOT allowed to interview the class teachers and pupils in their respective class during the school hours. In urgent cases, students may be contacted only through the school authorities.
8. If a student is seriously ill or suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, he/she should not be sent to school. A leave application has to be submitted to the Principal immediately. On recovery, a Doctor's



- Certificate has to be produced stating that he / she is fully cured and is fit for attending the classes.
9. In case of leave, except on the grounds of illness, the parents or guardians of the students themselves should get the leave granted by the Principal, well in advance.
 10. Parents are expected to attend Parents-Teachers Meeting after every examination. In case of any difficulty with regard to the functioning of the School or the progress of the students, the parents are encouraged to approach the Principal.
 11. Attendance on Parents - Teachers Meet is necessary. Results will not be handed over to relatives or friends.
 12. The Report card must be collected on Parents Teachers Meet Day. If not collected, the parent can collect it from Exam cell by prior appointment.
 13. Teachers of the School are not permitted to take tuitions of students of this School. Parents will not approach the teachers with such requests.
 14. No office business will be transacted on holidays and after the office hours.
 15. Students are not allowed to wear casual dress on their birthdays. No chocolate or toffee distribution is permitted in the school campus. However parents may donate eatables or something useful for Orphanage or Oldage Home visits under Philanthropic Activities organised every month.
 16. The School will not be held responsible for any accidents or untoward incidents on way to and back from School or in School or during picnics & camps etc.
 17. Children who fast are unable to concentrate on their studies. Parents are requested to help the child avoid this practice.
 18. The parents will fill in the application form of admission to the School before the admission is made and will agree to abide by all the rules of the School in force or that may be in future.
 19. Issue of various types of certificates.
Parents requesting the Principal's signature on various types of certifications should submit the certificate applications one day in advance. Parents are requested not to insist on issue of certificates on the spot. However, in urgent cases, they may approach the Principal's office before 1000 hrs on any working day.
 20. Parents and students will follow Covid-19 protocols while coming to school/inside the school and at home. They will inform the school immediately if either the child or any other member in the family is symptomatic.

FEE SCHEDULE

Since the Army Public School is integral to the Army Welfare Education Society, its primary aim is welfare through imparting education. In keeping with this un-materialistic approach, the fee is subsidized for children of Armed Forces Personnel and nominal for others. The fee structure is as per the rules laid down by AWES HQ, New Delhi and are subject to revision. The schedule of payment of fee is as follows.

(a) Fee will be collected on a quarterly basis.

(b) Security (refundable) and annual charges will be charged at the beginning of the session, together with the fee for the first quarter.

(c) The due date for fee deposition is as under.

 - (ii) Wards of Retired Army Personnel, Territorial Army personnel (TA), battle casualty and deceased Army personnel are not eligible.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

- (a) All the students must be in the School, five minutes before the morning assembly.
- (b) Students should always be well-dressed in proper uniform.
- (c) They should be regular in attendance. 75% attendance is mandatory.
- (d) They should bring all the required text books and writing materials to School daily
- (e) They should bring their own tiffin and drinking water.
- (f) They should be polite, courteous and respectful in conduct with their teachers, friendly with School mates and must use parliamentary language.
- (g) No student is allowed to leave the School premises during School hours without proper permission of the Principal. Children will only be allowed to leave the School on specific written requests from parents.
- (h) Students must look after the School property.
- (i) Students will follow Covid-19 protocols.

FORBIDDEN PRACTICES

1. No student should indulge in any of the following practices:-
 - (a) Spitting in or near the school building.
 - (b) Disfiguring or otherwise damaging any school property.
 - (c) Smoking.
 - (d) Any form of gambling.
 - (e) Use of drugs or intoxicants.
 - (f) Rowdy and rude behavior.
 - (g) Use of violence in any form.
 - (h) Casteism, Communalism or practice of untouchability.
 - (i) Eye teasing and derogatory remarks against a girl child.
 - (j) Carrying mobiles and sharp knives/any other thing.



FORMS OF DISCIPLINARY MEASURES

1. The following shall be the disciplinary measures which will be adopted by the school for students.
 - a. Fine
 - b. Expulsion
 - c. Rustication

Fine : It may be imposed on a student in the following cases -

 - (i) Absence from class without proper application from the parents or guardian.
 - (ii) Truancy and speaking in Hindi.
 - (iii) Willful damage to school property/Furniture/Fixtures.

Expulsion : Students expelled from the school will not be re-admitted. Cases of students expelled from other schools will be referred to the Managing Committee.

Rustication : Where a student is rusticated, he will not be admitted to the school till expiry of the period of rustication.

WITHDRAWALS/DISMISSALS

1. One month notice is to be given before the withdrawal of a student. Such a notice should be given in writing by the parents or the guardians. Requests by the pupils themselves will not be entertained.
2. No School leaving certificate will be issued unless all dues to the school have been paid in full and library books etc. returned.
3. Students can be dismissed by the School authorities on any one of the following grounds :-
 - (i) Irregularity in attendance.
 - (ii) Moral breach considered serious by the school management.
 - (iii) Behavioural Problems.
 - (iv) Non-payment of fees or chronic irregularity in payment of fees.
 - (v) Lack of noticeable improvement during quarterly assessments.
