
The Summer Vacation Assignments, which will be fun and activity based learning, have been prepared to keep the students active and observant. These assignments will be used for internal assessments/portfolios.

#### (A) FDRC PRIMARY LEVEL WORKSHOP NO 01/22-23

Workshop No. 01/22-23 was organised at HQ FDRC Shankar Vihar, New Delhi on the topic 'Inclusion' from 18-22 April. Mrs. Neha Chaturvedi (PRT) and Mrs. Nisha Bais (PRT) from Army Public School Gwalior attended the workshop. The workshop was taken by various mentors on various topics who shared their knowledge on inclusive education and its implementation. Information on what is inclusive education, its importance and why inclusive education is necessary was shared. The participants were told about the ways to screen and identify the learners' needs at the preparatory level; various needs of students such as cognition, language, social and emotional needs should be taken care as each student has his /her own requirement and can learn and adapt accordingly. Participants learnt how to address the learning gaps of learners in various subjects.

The participants were informed about the different kinds of barriers involved in inclusion and how to overcome them. Information on Universal Design of Learning (UDL) and Inquiry Based Learning (IBL) was given.

The whole workshop was very informative and it could help them to identify the various needs of learners, their learning styles, their strengths and areas of improvement which would be helpful in the effective and interesting teaching learning process. Participants learnt how to address the learning gaps of learners in various subjects. The participants learnt how to implement inclusive education in order to involve the students facing numerous challenges. The workshop would be fructiferous in dealing the students with learning disabilities and children with special needs.









#### (B) FDRC WEBINAR FOR GIFTED & TALENTED EDUCATION PROGRAMME
